HOT OCCUPATIONS IN THE KENYAN LABOUR MARKET OCTOBER 1 TO DECEMBER 31, 2017

This report provides a quarterly analysis of job advertisements published in the Daily Nation, The Standard and The East African Newspapers between 1st October to 31th December 2017. The total number of job vacancies posted in the said newspapers for the period was **3319**. Of these, Government Administrators vacancies accounted for 47.36%, Other Administrators and Managers 4.46% and Nursing and Mid-Wifery Professionals 4.25 %.

The occupations most featured in the newspapers over the reference period are tabulated here below (See Table 1)
