HOT OCCUPATIONS IN THE KENYAN LABOUR MARKET JANUARY 1 TO MARCH 31, 2022

This report provides a quarterly analysis of job advertisements published in the Daily Nation, The Standard and The East African Newspapers, from 1st January to 31st March 2022. The occupations most featured in the newspapers over the reference period are tabulated here below (**See Table 1**)

Advertised Vacancies by Occupational Groups January to 31st March 2022

Table 1 indicates that the highest number of the vacancies advertised in the period between 1st January to 31st March 2022 were in the following occupational groups:

- 1. "Legislators, Administrators and Managers" accounting for 48 %
- 2. "Craft and Related Trades Workers" accounting for 13 %
- 3. "Technicians and associate Professionals" accounting for 11 %
